## **GRADUATE INTERDISCIPLINARY SPECIALIZATION IN FILM STUDIES**

The Graduate Interdisciplinary Specialization in Film Studies requires 12 Credit Hours spread over four approved courses. Full requirements and information for the FS-GIS are available at go.osu.edu/FS-GIS

- 1. At least 9 hours must be from the Approved Course List.
- 2. At least 9 hours must be taken outside the student's home degree program/department.
- 3. At least 6 hours must be taken at the 7000 level or above.

For the GIS, <u>only 3 credit hours</u> may be taken with an upper-level, intensive film course that does NOT appear on the list – prior approval is required. To verify whether an upper-level film course would be accepted for use toward the GIS, please contact Program Coordinator at <u>piper.92@osu.edu</u> in advance of enrollment.

#### GIS approved course offerings from APPROVED COURSE LISTS (7000-level+)

#### FILMSTD 7001- Advanced Theory Seminar

• Film theory and methods seminar which focuses on a scholarly approach to cinema (auteurism, formalism, historicism, feminism, etc). Topics vary by semester.

### GIS approved course offerings from APPROVED COURSE LISTS (4000-5000-6000 level)

#### **ACCAD 6650 - History of Animation**

Overview of history/theory of animation, including origin, Hollywood studio, World, contemporary forms.

#### **ENGLISH 4578 – Special Topics in Film (Prof. Jesse Schotter)**

• Examination of topics, themes, genres, directors, periods, or movements in cinema (topics vary).

#### **ENGLISH 6778.01- Intro to Grad Study in Film/Theory (Prof. Ryan Friedman)**

• Advanced survey of the methodologies, contexts, and development of film and film theory (topics vary).

#### HISTART 5901- Silent Cinema- 1895-1927

• Evolution of silent film from its origins as a technological novelty to its fullest realization as an internationally divergent art form.

#### **HISTART 5910- Documentary Film**

History of documentary cinema as it shapes a wide range of moving image practices.

# GIS Approved ELECTIVE, not part of APPROVED COURSE LIST / permitted for 3 CH option. SLAVIC 5580 Cinema of Real Existing Socialism

Focuses on cinema under so-called real existing socialism in Poland and Czechoslovakia (1950s-1980s). The course addresses how directors navigated the field between censorship and statemandated cinematic aesthetics, and how the vision of a utopian communist society found expression in the form of film.
