• Slavic, American, British sci-fi as reflection of cultural concerns, including progress, utopia, identity, etc.

• Study of Latin American film; relationship between film and the society in which it is produced.

## **SPANISH 4581 – Spanish Film** (Offering may have language prerequisite)

• Study of Spanish film; relationship between film and the society in which it is produced.

• Study of gender representation in relationship to race, sexuality, and class in cinema. Topics vary.
