### FILM STUDIES MAJOR – courses offered this semester

#### Film Studies Major – Pre-requisite course offerings:

##### English 2263 – Introduction to Film

- Intro to methods of reading film texts by analyzing cinema as technique, system, cultural product.

#### Film Studies Major – Core course offerings:

##### FILMSTD 2271 – Introduction to Film Studies

- Intro to the field of Film Studies and survey of major theories of film analysis for incoming FS majors.

##### HISTART 2901 – Intro to World Cinema

- Chronological survey of the most influential and recognized film artists / film movements of the world.

- Emergence and various instantiations of avant-garde filmmaking across the history of film.

##### HISTART 5905 – Avant-Garde Film

- Significant historical contributions to avant-garde cinema and stylistic evolution since 1920s.

##### CHINESE 4405 – China in Chinese Film (*taught in English*)

- Overview of Chinese cinema, with focus on issues of nationhood, national identity, and national trauma.

- Intro to the cinema and classic films of France. Taught in English.

- Survey of Italian cinema from beginnings to today; special emphasis on neorealism. Taught in English.

- Examination of topics, themes, genres, directors, periods, or movements in cinema.

##### FILMSTD 3660 – Documentary Film Studies

- Upper-level course in documentary for film majors.

### **FILMSTD 4640 – Studies in Cinema History**

- Upper-level course on film history for film studies majors.

### **FILMSTD 4670H - Cinema and the Historical Avant-Garde (OPEN TO NON-HONORS FILM STUDENTS)**

- Emergence and various instantiations of avant-garde filmmaking across the history of film.

### **FILMSTD 4895 – Senior Seminar in Film Studies**

- Selected problems (themes, movements, theories, genres, styles, etc.) in film studies; topics vary.

### **FRENCH 2801 – Classics of French Cinema (taught in English)**

- Intro to the cinema and classic films of France.

### **HISTART 3901 – World Cinema Today**

- Intro to the art of international cinema, including its forms and varied content, socio-political conditions.

### **HISTART 5905 – Avant-Garde Film**

- Significant historical contributions to avant-garde cinema and stylistic evolution since 1920s.

### **ITALIAN 2053 – Introduction to Italian Cinema (taught in English)**

- Survey of Italian cinema from the beginnings to today, with special emphasis on neorealism.

### **ITALIAN 2055 – Mafia Movies (taught in English)**

- Exploration of Italian and American Mafia movies, television hits, and the myth of the Mafia.

### **ITALIAN 2056 – Love and Difference on the Italian Screen**

- Exploration of representations of love have been conditioned by questions of identity through representations of eros, romance and friendship in a variety of moving images.

### **JAPANESE 4400 – Japanese Film and Visual Culture (taught in English)**

- An overview of Japanese cinema and visual media, with a focus on genre.

### **MUSIC 3344 – Film Music**

- Study of music's function in film across history, in Hollywood, international, independent film.

### **SLAVIC 3310 – Science Fiction: East vs. West (taught in English)**

- Slavic, American, British sci-fi as reflection of cultural concerns, including progress, utopia, identity, etc.

### **WGSST 4527.01 – Studies in Gender and Cinema (Topics vary by semester)**

- Tools of feminist film criticism applied to topics including spectatorship, film history, stardom, genre, etc.

- Intermediate film/video analysis and production; storytelling in filmmaking through research/projects.

- Advanced-level course offers for an understanding of the fundamentals of directing narrative film.
